Program

- Sowing and Arranging the Spring Palette by Meg Laughon, professional floral designer in Lynchburg, and Foxie Morgan, owner of flower farm and event home, Pharsalia, in Nelson County
 - Introduction by Missy Buckingham
 - "Gardening begins in January with a dream" seeds! (See attachment)
 - Branches: Corylopsis (type of Witch Hazel; good in shade and with deer), Burning Bush, early Snowball Viburnum, Deutzia Chartreuse (bright green especially pretty at night), Elizabeth Tulip Magnolia (yellow flowers), White Forsythia, White Redbud, Edgeworthia (has flowers like lantana, in the Daphne family, good for deer), Apricot Quince, Curly Willow (can make a nest of curly willow branches in container instead of using frog; use chlorine tablets to keep branches from making water dirty)
 - Flowers: Daffodils (cut when still closed but just showing color, hold dry in fridge, cut again if necessary and put in water on the day of use, warm water will open faster), Anemone, Hellebore (longevity trick for young blooms: lightly slit from top to bottom, put in water up to the neck; best longevity when cut after they go to seed), Kale (provide 6 months of interest)
 - Native Perennials: Arrowwood, Baptisia, (handhout), lettuces, Radish (20 days from seed to veg!), Apple Mint (fuzzy, scented foliage), Mountain Mint (fall flower and blue green foliage)
 - Tips and Tricks:
 - Quick Dip: smidge in the water; dip heads of hydrangea in water with diluted QD
 - Chlorine Tablets keep branches from making water dirty (for sale at Pharsalia)
 - Cutting & Pinching
 - Pinch: Snapdragons
 - Cut: Zinnias (cut way back, not just to the branch), Baptisia and Peonies (cut heavily but leave enough foliage to feed roots), Dahlias
 - Cover your mechanics with moss first then stick plant material through moss
 - Solution to keep moss green: 1 oz yellow food coloring, 1/2 oz green food coloring, 1 qt water
 - Tip from Ron Morgan re: Cala Lilies: peel up about 3 fibers from the bottom to bend stem into shape; won't last as long after stripping but will stay curled
 - Find containers, etc. via Google App -> "Shop for Products" -> take a picture

- Dahlias: instead of removing for winter -> cut back, cover with straw, cover row with plastic; this protects rotects the tuber from too much moisture while allowing rain to get into nearby ground; uncover around the middle of March
- Where to buy plants: Colesville Nursery, Ivy Market, Village Garden Center (Waynesboro), Millmont Greenhouses (Waynesboro), Saunders Brother Farm Market (Nelson County)
- Native Perennials: arrowwood, baptisia, (handhout), lettuce, radish (20 days from seed to veg!), apple mint (fuzzy, scented foliage), mountain mint (fall flower w/blue green foliage),
